ARC NOTIFICATION

From the BMHA Board

Homeowners throughout Brook
Meadows are constantly making
improvements to the interior and exterior
of their homes. This is great as these
modifications generally increase our
property values. When considering
exterior modifications it is (generally)
required to file a **Property Modification**Request (PMR) with the Architectural
Review Committee (ARC) before work
is initiated.

Please be advised that everyone in Brook Meadows is subject to the CC&R's. The CC&R's are available for review on the website (brookmeadows.org). The PMR form can also be found on the website under the tab Architectural. The following is provided as guidance on when to initiate a PMR: All projects that can be seen from the street or will impact the view of your neighbors should be presented to the ARC – **BEFORE** the **projects begins**. This includes, but is not limited to, changes to your property including:

- Major Landscaping
- External structural changes
- Out buildings
- Exterior Painting
- Driveway resurfacing and paving
- Mailboxes
- Other projects that will affect the external appearance of your property. Small planting in current beds, or structural maintenance of your property with "like kind" and color" will not need approval *The PMR process is easy and quick so if in doubt file to be safe!!*

On Monday, April 15th, at 6:00 PM we will be discussing "When Breath Becomes Air" by Paul Kalanithi. We will meet at the Taylor residence, 4501 Shadycreek). "When Breath Becomes Air" is a non-fiction autobiographical book written by Paul Kalanithi. It is a memoir about his life and illness, battling stage IV metastatic lung cancer. It was posthumously published by Random House in 2016.

In his last year of neurosurgical residency at Stanford University, Dr. Paul Kalanithi experiences negative changes in his health. Rapid weight loss and severe back and chest pains begin to raise concern for him and his wife, Lucy. Paul worries that a possible cause for his symptoms is spinal cancer – unlikely for people in their thirties. However, when X-ray results in a routine medical checkup return looking just fine, he and his primary care physician attribute the symptoms to aging and work overload. At thirty-six, Dr. Kalanithi had gained national prominence and become a respected member of the medical community.

On **Sunday, May 19th at 6:00 PM** at the home of **Mark Adams** we will discuss "*The Big Rich*" by Bryan

Burrough, published in 2009. It's a fascinating story about the rise and fall of the greatest Texas oil fortunes - Roy Cullen, Clint Murchison, Sid Richardson and of course H. L. Hunt. Four families of staggering wealth and equally outsized personalities used this enormous wealth to shape American business, culture and politics from Texas to Washington and beyond.
