A Gem in Texas

Just outside La Porte Texas lies the historical battleship The USS Texas, an attraction about which you have probably given little thought. Well....me too, and I'm former Navy and an admitted World War I and World War II buff. It is seemingly easy to fall into the trap of believing that these military ships become museums, merely because of their names, but that is most certainly not the case for The USS Texas.

The Texas was completed prior to the outbreak of World War I in Europe, and is the oldest surviving modern battleship in the world. As such, any documentaries about naval warfare in WWI usually include footage of her at anchor in LaPorte. Upon the United States entry into WWI in 1917, The Texas sailed to join the British Grand Fleet in Scotland, and as integral to that unit, she helped with both North Sea blockade duty of the German High Seas Fleet, and with convoy duty. After Jutland in 1916, nothing really transpired between the two fleets, but following the Armistice (ending the war) in November 1918, she participated in escorting the surrendering High Seas Fleet back to Scotland. But wait...there's more!

In World War II, The Texas was active in convoy duty, and then first fired in anger during the invasion of North Africa in 1942, providing artillery support. More convoy duty followed. Then came the Normandy invasion, in which The Texas was a key player in the bombardment of Omaha Beach; at one point positioned only 3000 yards from the beach while firing her 14" shells in a very flat trajectory. She was then

positioned off Cherbourg and dueled with a large artillery placement, winning but taking her first fatality in the process. This action completed her Normandy and Atlantic involvement.

Off to the Pacific....and.....Iwo Jima! The Texas provided pre-invasion bombardment, then Marine artillery support for the entire Iwo Jima operation. From there? Try Okinawa! True enough, she performed the same mission for the Okinawa campaign; while ducking kamikazes, by the way.

In summary, our Texas gem fought with the British Grand Fleet in World War I, and was heavily involved in the North Africa campaign, the Normandy invasion, Iwo Jima and Okinawa. She can be visited at 3523 Independence Pkwy, in La Porte, just outside of Houston. Not sure about you, but on my next trip in that area, I'm going to drop by and pay my respects!
